Some of you may realise that our biggest objective as a branch is the support of local students in the area in the pursuit of becoming members. Again we have been in a position to offer financial support to one of our local students.

Victoria became known to us when she sat her Foundation Diploma in Felixstowe in November 2016. Unlike most of us who were already in the business when we began studying, Victoria was actually an undergraduate already studying towards her degree. She was self-funding her diploma as well as supporting herself whilst at University. In order to give Victoria the best chance at attaining her goals the branch committee agreed to fund the Advanced Diploma including copies of the course texts.

In her own words: "I became aware of the ICS for the first time while completing an internship with a Ship Broking firm in Oslo in 2016. From then on, it was clear to me that I wished to pursue a career in Ship broking.

As I do not come from a family with a shipping background, I felt it would be incredibly beneficial to get a shipping qualification under my belt while still at University. I undertook and passed the 'Introduction to Shipping' module and found it a good base to learn more about the industry.

This first module was self-funded and I was eager to sit further modules in 2017. I was, however, unsure whether I could justify the expense while still in the final year of my Economics degree. Therefore, I was delighted when the East Anglia Branch offered to fund me for two further modules as well as providing invaluable mentoring support during my studies.
