Continuing her speech she advised that it is a challenging time for the maritime sector and despite this Liverpool's maritime activities continue to grow.

Peel Ports have secured a new permanent trans-atlantic container service. The Canadian Express service will connect southern European Ports with Liverpool and ultimately Canada. The route will be served by eight 5,500 TEU vessels with two calls per week.

The Liverpool 2 container terminal is one of the most operationally efficient and modern terminals in Northern Europe, it is capable of accommodating the world's largest container vessels, future-proofing the facility to allow global shippers 'ship-to-door' access to major import centers at the heart of the UK. I am sure all agree this is great news for the local economy and some really positive news, given the current economic climate.

A little further up the coast line is The Port of Garston. Garston currently handles around 600k tonnes per annum, welcoming around 280 ships a year.

More success for Liverpool

No not the football club but Peel Ports

The world's top five shipping lines are all now calling at Liverpool following confirmation that Chinese giant COSCO Shipping is to ship via the port.

COSCO Shipping will take slots on an existing Canadian service via Montreal with OOCL. It joins MSC, Maersk, CMA and Hapag in starting or growing a presence in Liverpool.

The decision follows a successful trial by COSCO Shipping in October, since when MSC has also introduced a new call to Liverpool, as part of a rotation including Canada, Turkey and various southern European ports.

It is the third major line announcement for Liverpool in the last few months, as the 2M shipping alliance confirmed at the end of 2018 that Liverpool will be a permanent call on its TA4 transatlantic service.

In February, Peel Ports also announced that it was aiming to create 250 jobs, mostly in Liverpool, to deal with continued business growth.

Mark Whitworth, Chief Executive of Peel Ports said: "There's a real sense of momentum in Liverpool just now. Hundreds of cargo owners have already given their backing to the port as their natural trade gateway, and now more shipping lines are coming on board too. In these uncertain times, one thing that is sure is Liverpool's prime location for serving the heart of the UK marketplace. We're confident that this is just the start with COSCO shipping, especially with the recent success of our new MSC service too."

Alan Newell, General Manager of COSCO's agents China Shipping UK Agency, said: "Our trial at the Port of Liverpool last year was very successful. On the strength of that we are looking to market slots to our customers with a view to growing traffic on the route. It's clear that Liverpool has a lot of potential as a gateway for many cargo owners in the north of the UK and we are confident that we are capitalising on this growing demand at the right time."

In a further development Dutch company WEC Lines has announced a new service connecting the Port of Liverpool with two major Portuguese ports and a new link with Spain.

The new weekly service will connect Liverpool with Setubal and Leixoes using the 882teu vessel mv FRANCOP. The direct calls to Liverpool will import a range of Iberian products.
